Hoosier Honor Flight donates to Gold Star Mothers Honor Flight

The last Hoosier Honor Flight check was donated on 27 October 2011 to the *Gold Star Mothers Fund, Honor Flight* in the mayor's office, Lafayette, Indiana. Mrs. Pam Mow, President of the Indiana Gold Star Mothers, gratefully accepted the donation – the largest to date in their drive to fund their first chartered flight for WWII veterans from Lafayette to Washington, DC.

Gold Star Mothers lost a son or daughter on active duty military service in defense of the United States. No mother wants to become eligible for membership. Members help each other and help to preserve the foundations of the nation for which their sons and daughters died. That the Indiana Gold Star Mothers, who lost their children in preservation of freedom, would assume the task of taking WWII veterans, who preserved freedom during the greatest war in history, to see their war memorial in Washington, DC is both stunningly appropriate and gratifying.

Polly Tilford, the primary administrative assistant for all four of the Hoosier Honor Flights, lost her daughter, Sarah Beth Tilford, from this Earth in March 2011. The last Hoosier Honor Flight was on 28 April 2010. This final check included all the memorial donations in Sarah's name to Hoosier Honor Flight and all the funds remaining after the final Hoosier Honor Flight expenses were paid.

VFW Post 604 has always been closely involved with running Hoosier Honor Flight. I recall one evening with some Veterans Day Elves working hours at our house, stuffing big *Ziploc* bags with Hoosier Honor Flight T-shirts, hats, ID cards, neck lanyards, and cell phone lists. I think their names were Elf Joe Hardin, Elf Cathi Johnson, and Elf Terri Languell. I also recall telling Joe, before the second flight of 172 veterans and guardians, that he was the first alternate and almost certain to go. Surely 172 people — most in their late 80s - would not ALL show up by the zero-dark-thirty deadline at the Monroe County Airport! Joe had his own HHF T-shirt, HHF hat, ID, etc. He was ready to go. All 172 did show. Joe did not go on the

second flight. He was left at the airport. I think I waved to him as the plane took off. Next time he went.
